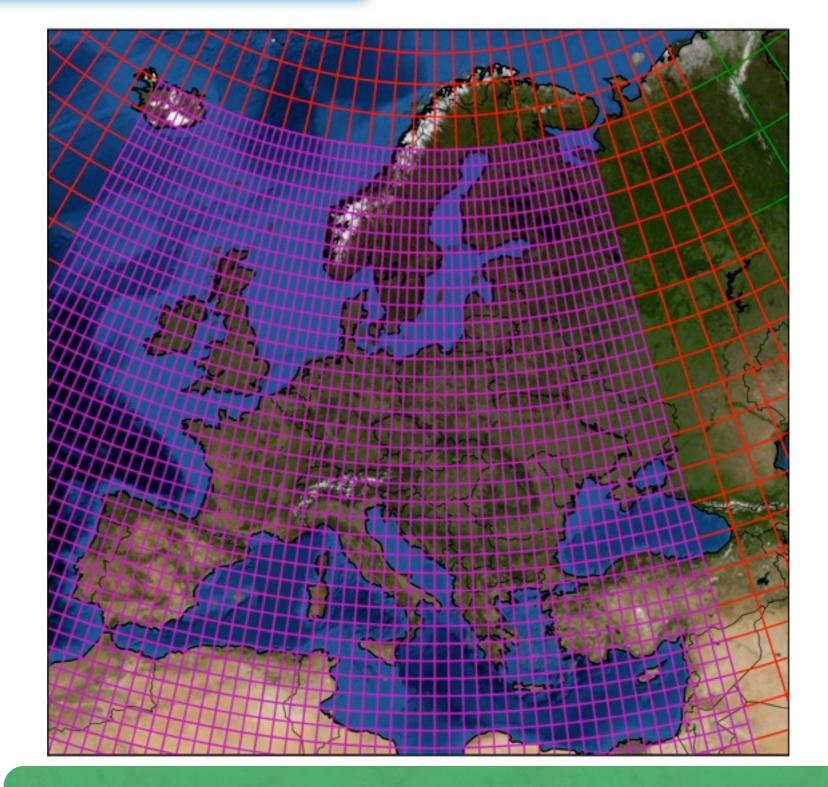

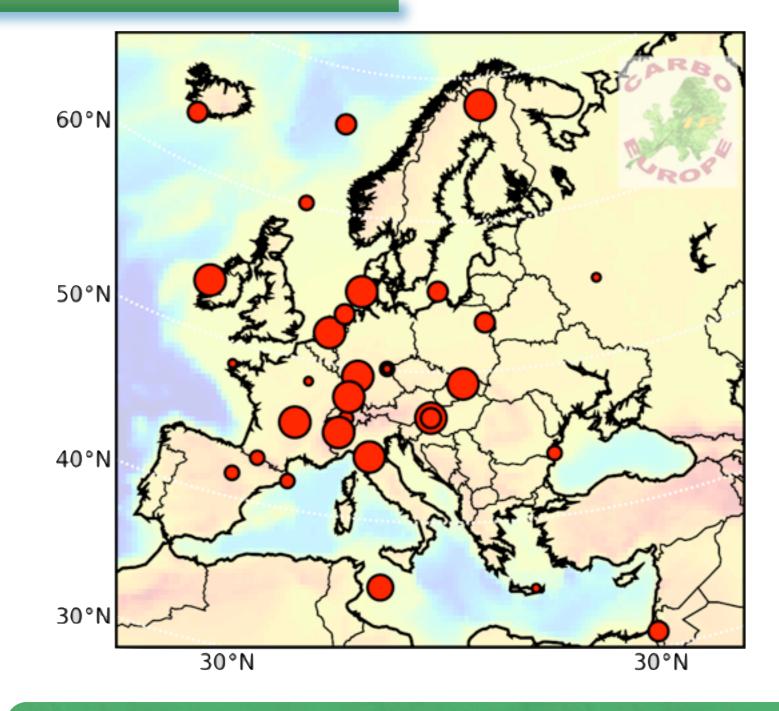


TM5 2-way nested transport glb6x4, eur3x2, eur1x1, 25/34 levels ECMWF 3-hourly meteo

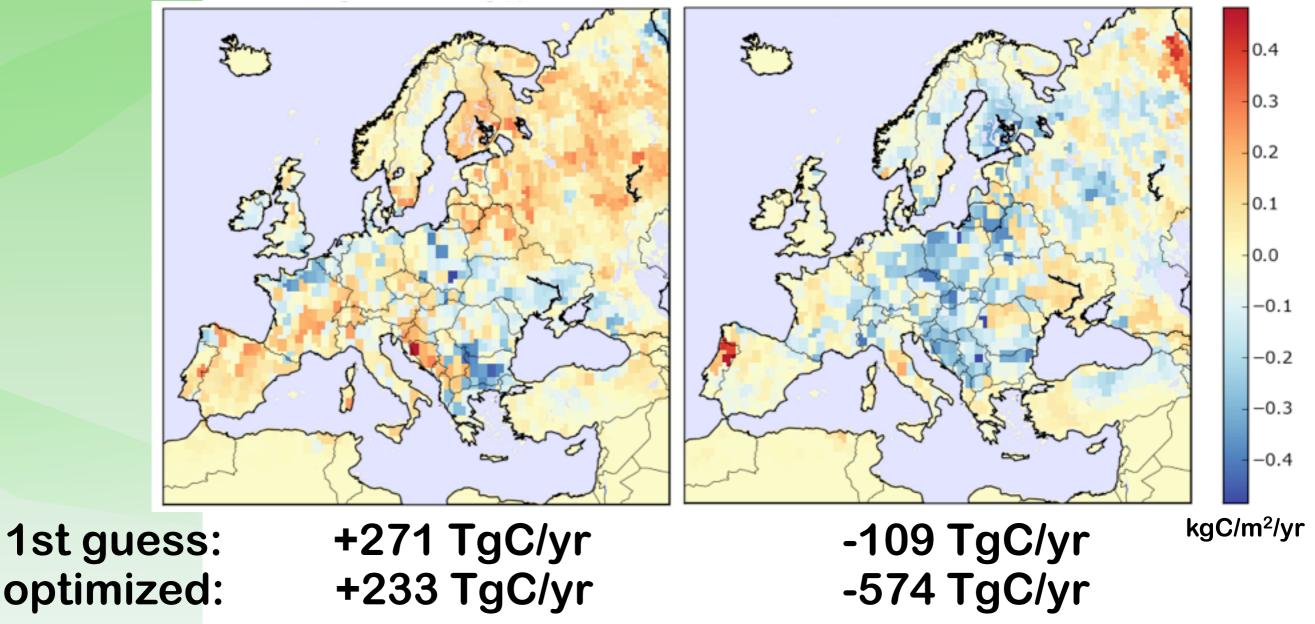


## **Interannual Variability**

#### June-July-August 2003 June-July-August 2005

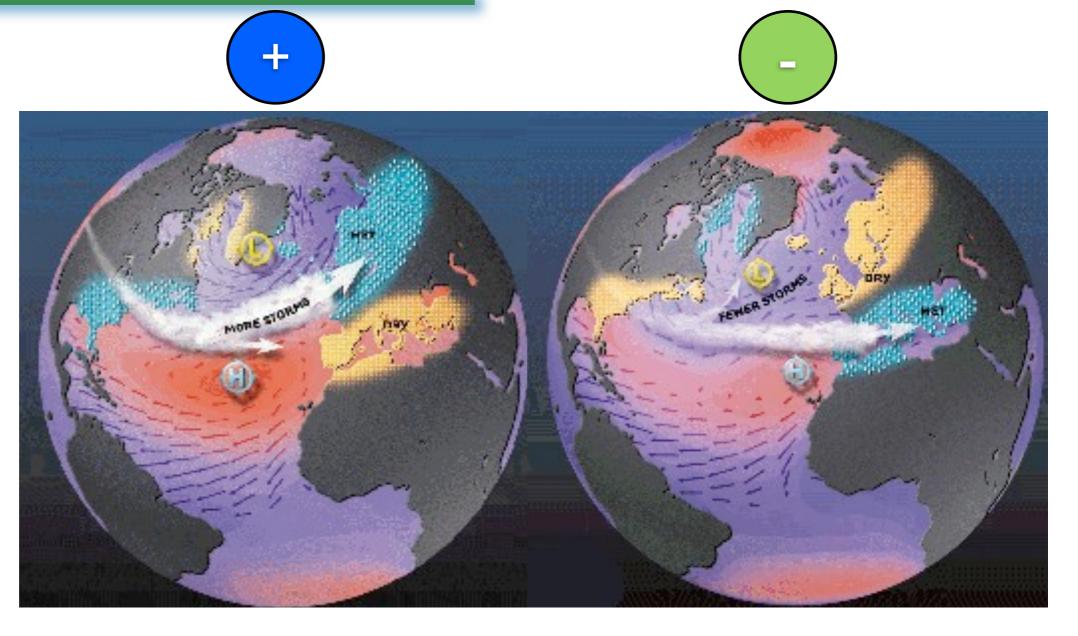

#### Positive Phase:

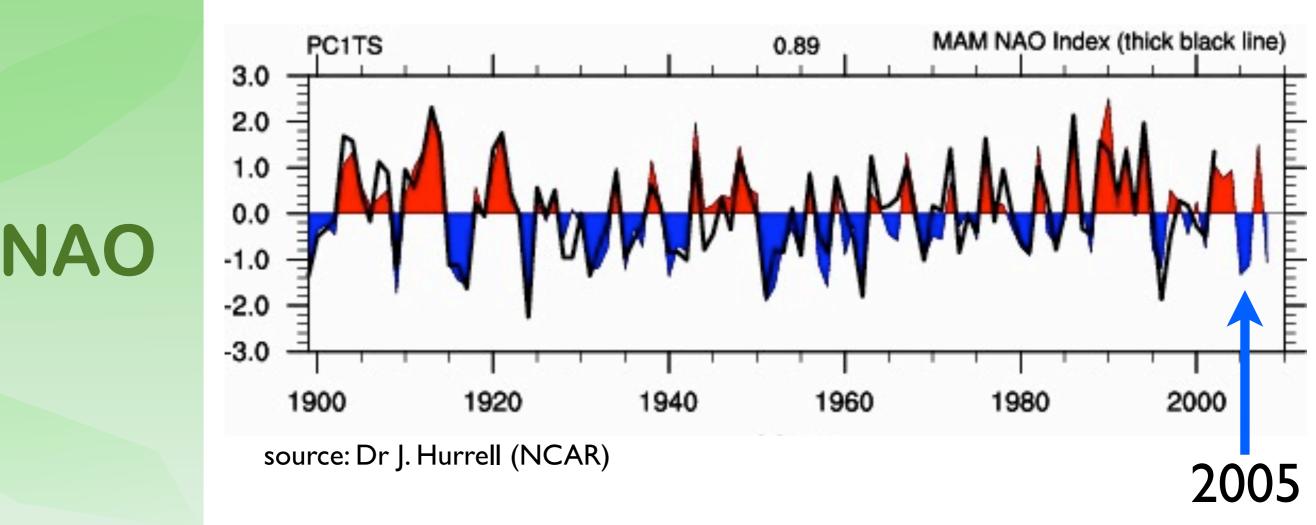
Stronger Azores H

High P gradient
More westerly storms
Moisture goes North

#### Negative Phase:

Weaker Azores H
Weaker Iceland L
Low P gradient

Moisture goes South

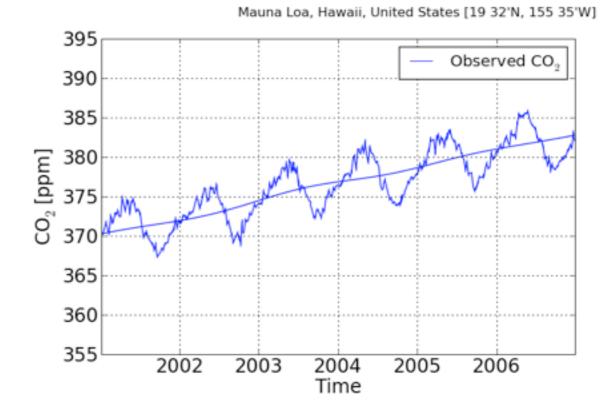


### NAO index 1995-2008 bars = March-April-May avg

#### Forward simulations with CO<sub>2</sub> and <sup>13</sup>CO<sub>2</sub> in TM5



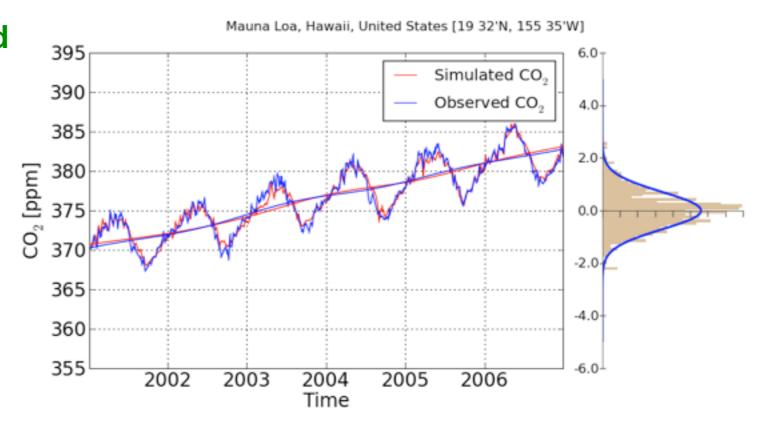

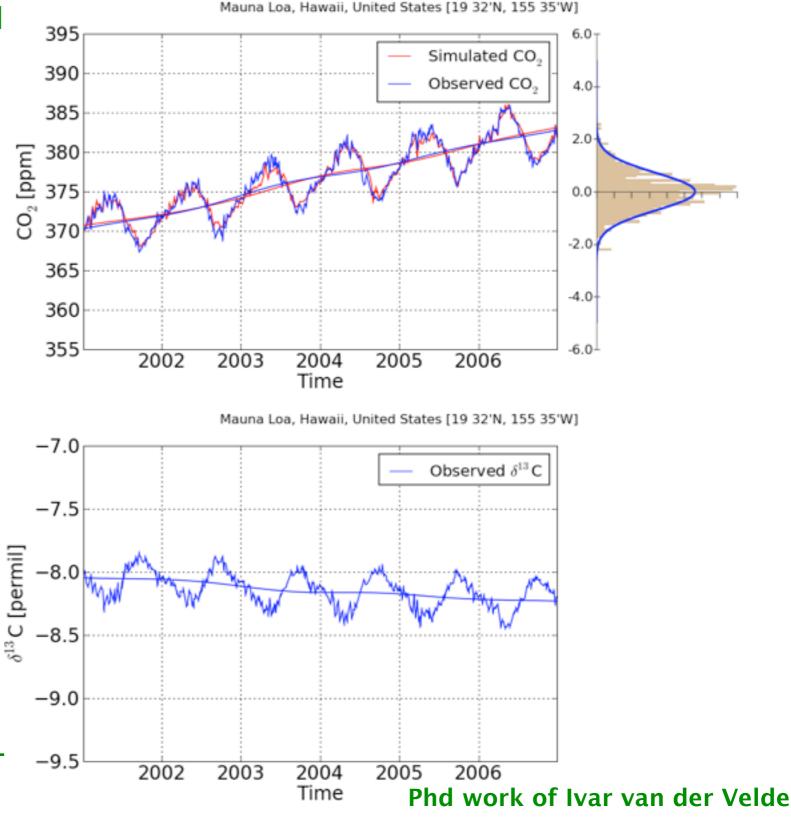

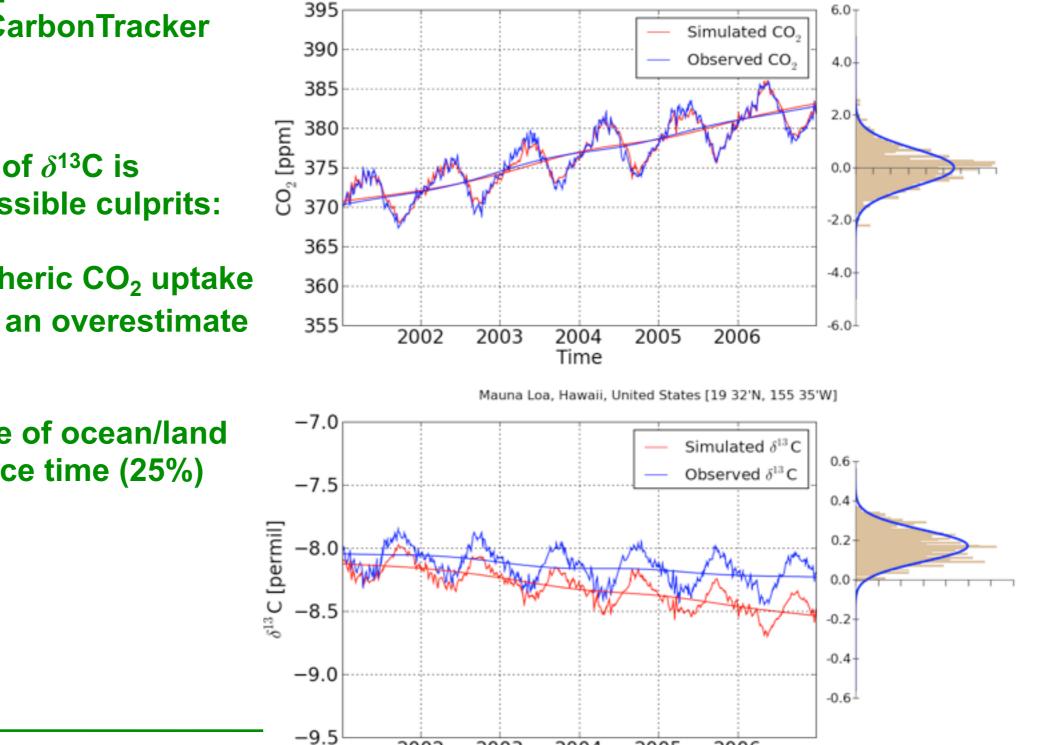

• Atmospheric CO<sub>2</sub> is well simulated by the optimized CarbonTracker fluxes

- Downward trend of  $\delta^{13}$ C is overestimated, possible culprits:
  - Lack of biospheric CO<sub>2</sub> uptake (1 Pg/y), hence an overestimate of other fluxes
  - Underestimate of ocean/land carbon residence time (25%)

## Samenvatting

- Er zijn leuke mogelijkheden voor studenten om mee te werken!

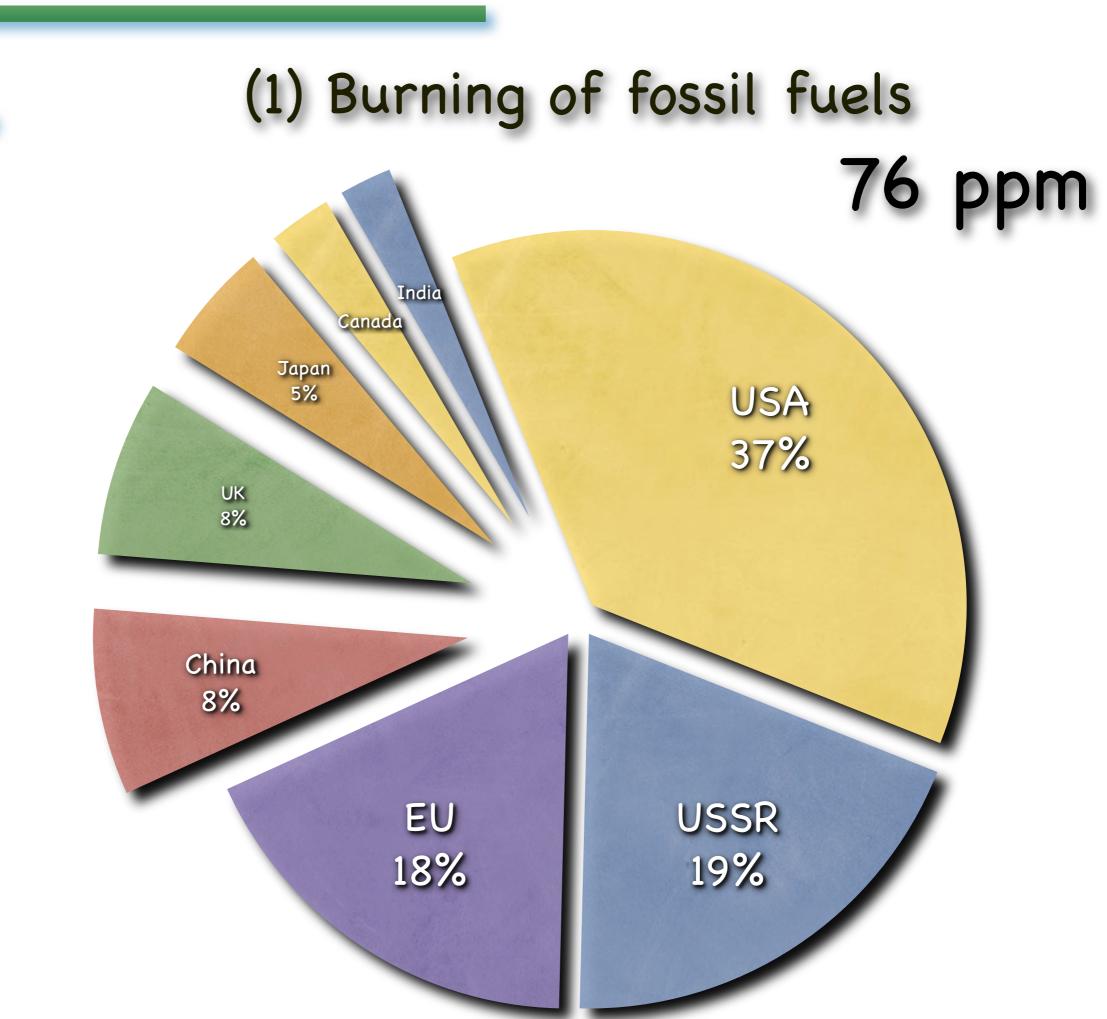

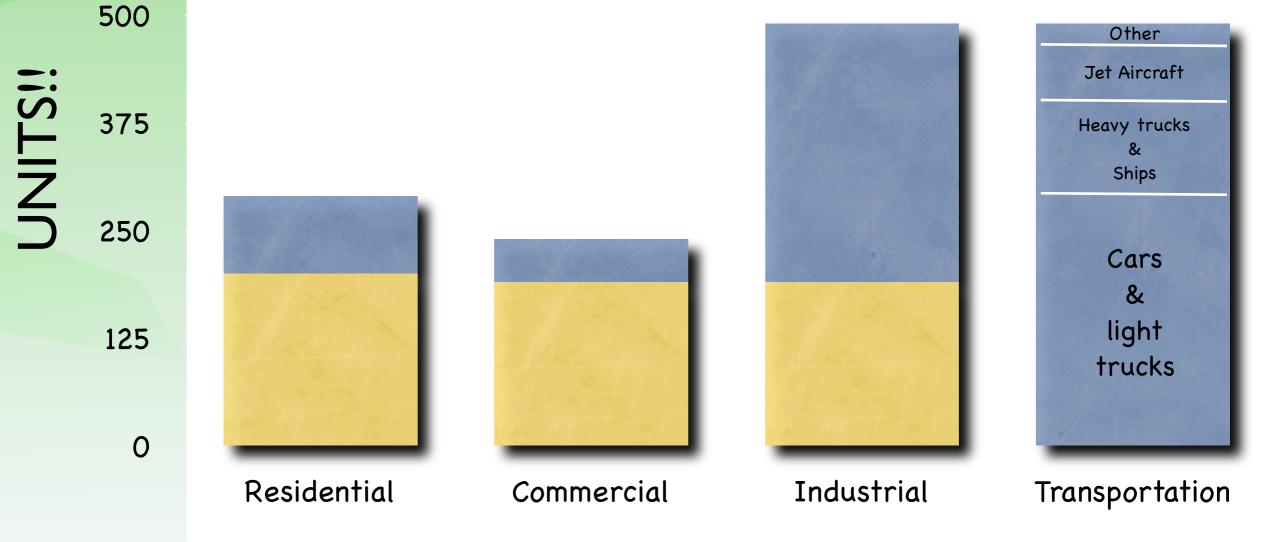






Electricity Generation

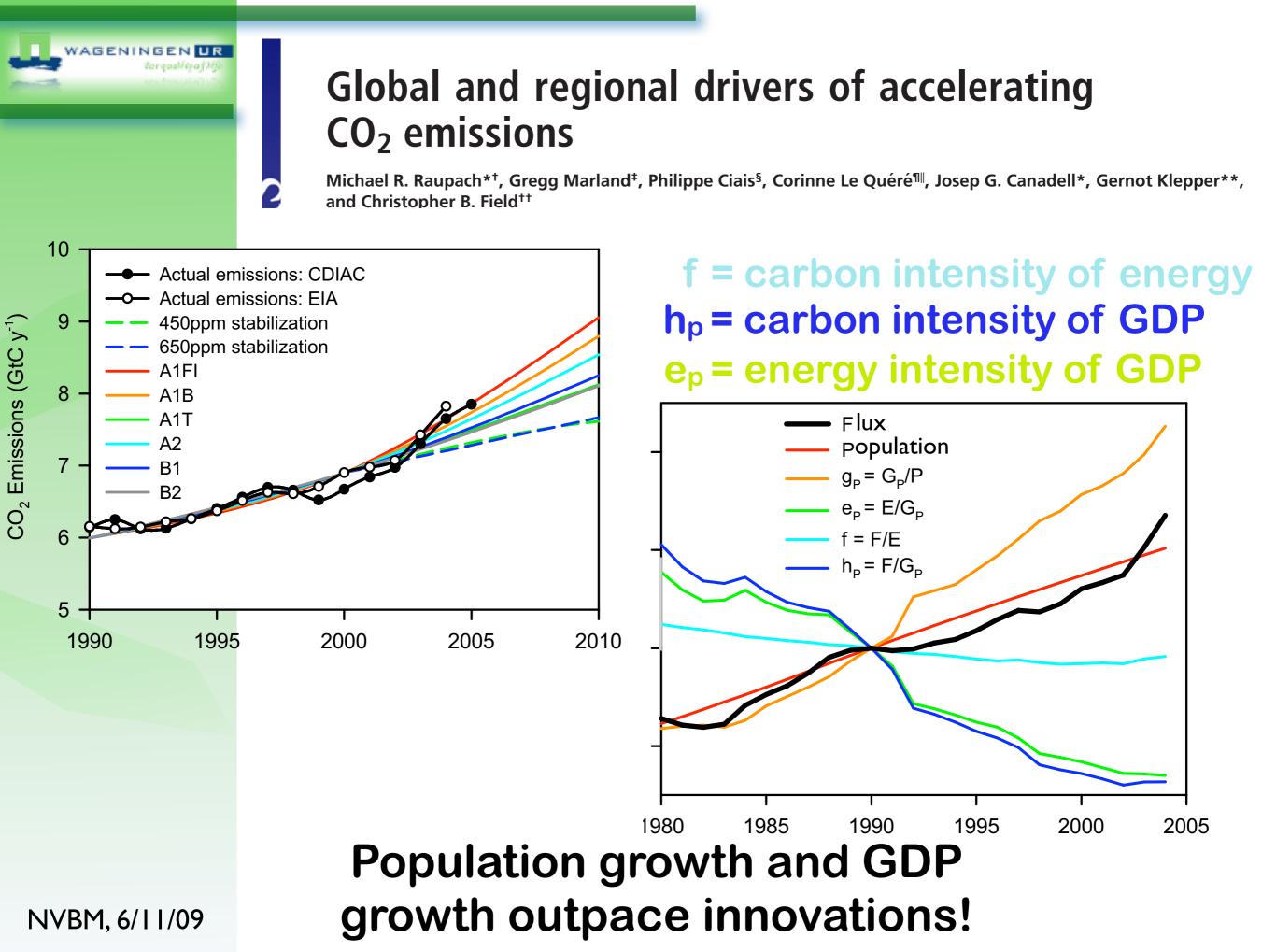
Direct Burning



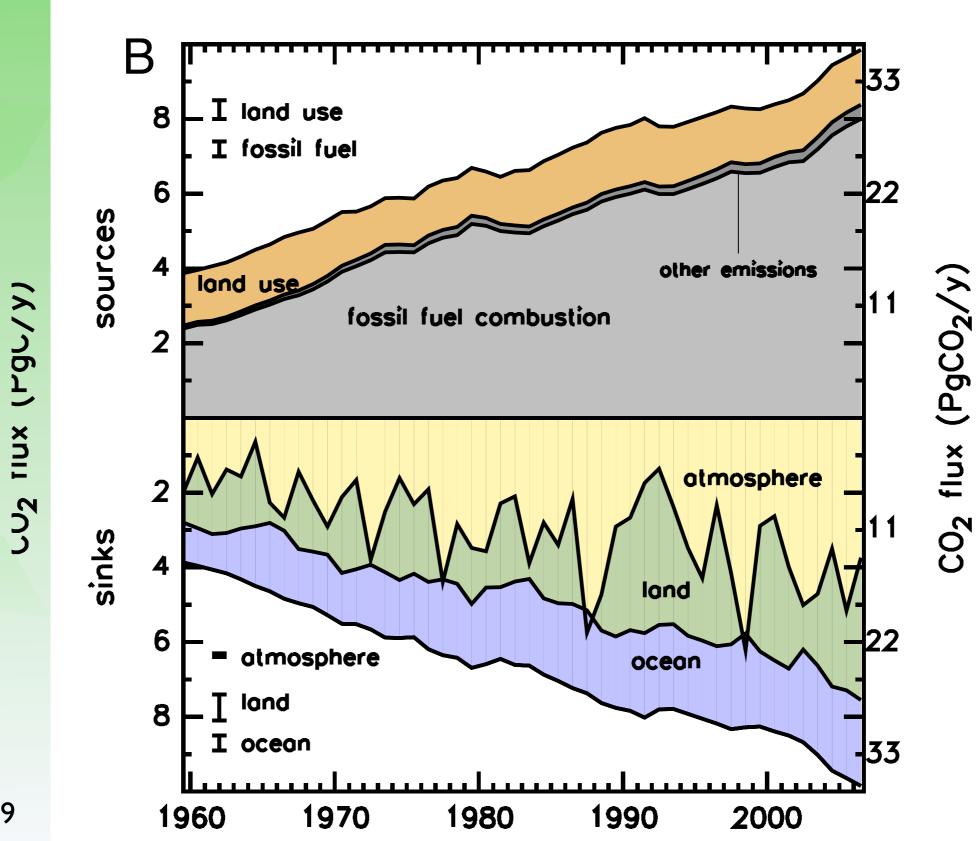
